Questions to Promote Higher Order Thinking for Reading. Asking questions is a regular part of reading instruction, but asking the right types of questions can be harder than it seems. Questions should be designed to promote higher level thinking, encourage students discussion, build better understanding of a concept, and challenge students' thinking.

Higher-order Questions (HOQ) Higher-order questions are those that the students cannot answer just by simple recollection or by reading the information "verbatim" from the text. Higher-order questions put advanced cognitive demand on students. They encourage students to think beyond literal questions. Higher-order questions promote critical thinking skills because these types of questions expect students to apply, analyze, synthesize, and evaluate information instead of simply recalling ...
